Dietetic Internship Program Goals, Outcome Statements and Target Measures

The Baptist Hospital System Dietetic Internship program will: Prepare graduates to be competent entry-level dietitians.

- 1. 90% of graduates take the CDR credentialing exam for dietitian nutritionists within 12 months of program completion
- 2. The program's one year pass rate (graduated who pass the registration exam within one year of first attempt) on CDRs credentialing exam for dietitian nutritionists is at least 80%
- 3. Of program graduates who seek employment, 70% are employed in nutrition and dietetics or related field within 12 months of graduation

Provide a supply of well-trained professionals to meet the employment needs of this and the surrounding area.

- 1. At least 80% of program interns complete program/ degree requirements within 15 months (150% Of the program length)
- 2. 40% of the graduates of the program will obtain a position in the field of dietetics in the state of Texas within one year of successfully passing the RD examination
- 3. Over a five-year period, 10% of graduating interns will be recruited by the Baptist Health System
- 4. On the employer survey question rating the students "Quality of Work," 100% of respondents will rate the graduate as "above average" or "outstanding"

Prepare graduates for life-long learning and advancement in dietetics through professional activities and development.

- 1. 100% of the interns will be student members of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.
- 2. Each intern will attend a minimum of four (4) local dietetic association meetings/ CEU opportunities each year.
- 3. Within 5 years of completing the program, 40% of graduates will earn a specialty certification.
- 4. Within 5 years of completing the program, 20% of graduates will have held or currently hold a leadership role in a professional, community or civic organization.
